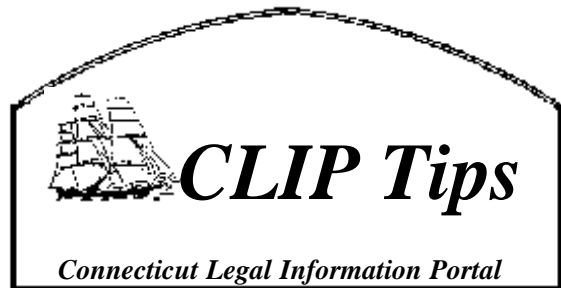

**HOW TO FIND A UNITED STATES TREATY
OR OTHER INTERNATIONAL AGREEMENT
IN THE UNIVERSITY OF CONNECTICUT SCHOOL OF LAW LIBRARY**

Treaties are functionally part of the statutory law of the United States. Where you look for the text of a treaty or other international agreement to which the United States is a party depends on when the agreement was made and what you know about it. The Law Library holds three print sources and one online source containing the texts of treaties and other international agreements made between 1776 and 1949. They are indicated in the table below.

Locating By Citation

Treaties in the *Statutes at Large* are cited as *Stat.* Treaties in *Malloy* are cited as *Malloy* and treaties in *Miller* are cited as *Miller*. If you have a citation to *T.S.* (Treaty Series), *E.A.S.* (Executive

Agreement Series), *S. Exec. Doc.* (Senate Executive Documents Series), or *Bevans, Malloy, or Miller*, those treaties can be found in *Bevans*. Just look for the designated volume and page number in the appropriate set.

Locating By Subject or Party

If you do not have a citation you may find a treaty by subject or party in the *Bevans* index, which is shelved at the end of the set. Alternatively, you may look up a treaty by date, subject, party, or even citation in Kavass and Michael, *United States Treaties and Other International Agreements Cumulative Index 1776-1949: Cumulative Index to United States Treaties and other International Agreements 1776-1949 as Published in Statutes at Large, Malloy, Miller, Bevans, and other Relevant Sources*. This 4-volume set is shelved on the 4th Floor at JX 231 U58.

Locating By Citation

Treaties in *United States Treaties and Other International Agreements* are cited as *U.S.T.* Treaties in the *Treaties and Other International Acts Series* are cited as *T.I.A.S.* Senate Treaty Documents (*Treaty Doc.* or *Exec. Doc.*) and Senate Executive Reports (*Exec. Rpt.*) can be found in the CIS Microfiche collection. The fiche is filed according to year and then sequentially within Congress. CIS accession numbers for these documents will include the year, an "S" for Senate, usually a "38," for the Foreign Affairs Committee, a "4" or "5" depending on whether the document is a Treaty Document or an Executive Report, and the number of document (e.g., 1999: S384-1). If you have a KAV cite you can look in *Hein's United States Treaties and Other International Agreements Current Service* or *Hein Online*. If you have a C.T.I.A. cite you can look in *Consolidated Treaties and International Agreements Current Document Service* or the *TIARA* database. KAV numbers are temporary; they are superseded by T.I.A.S. numbers. Correlation tables are provided in Hein publications. Treaties in *International Legal Materials* are cited as *I.L.M.* Just look for the designated numbers in the appropriate set.

Locating By Subject or Party

Indexes to the CIS Microfiche (to find Senate Treaty documents) are in the 3rd Floor Reference collection at KF 49 C622. You may search them by subject and name as well as by citation. If you do not have a citation you may find a treaty by title, subject or party in Kavass' *United States Treaties Index 1776-2000 Consolidation*, which is kept up-to-date by supplements and is located on the 4th Floor at JX 231 U58
