A. What Do We Have?

The law library has access to over 300 electronic library research databases covering a wide range of academic subjects. Most of these are university-wide subscriptions made available through the Homer Babbidge Library at Storrs. While some databases are specifically devoted to legal content, others are multi-disciplinary in scope and cover a variety of subjects in addition to law. Some provide specialized coverage of the sciences, medicine, business and other subjects that relate to law. Since legal research often requires access to information in other fields, this broad selection of multi-disciplinary and subject specific electronic resources can be quite complementary to the study of law.

B. Where Do I Begin?

Begin at **law library's Web page** (www.law.uconn.edu/library) and select the link to **Research Databases** (www.law.uconn.edu/library/database). The databases are organized alphabetically by title, by subject, and in a "Most Frequently Used" drop-down menu featuring databases that are particularly relevant to legal research. Brief content descriptions appear on the alphabetical lists. More detailed information is available by clicking on the Info icon. You can browse the database list by specific subject categories. Databases are also accessible by keyword search. Type the words "full text" in the **Search Parameters** box and select **Database Title**, **Short Description** and **Annotation** as fields to search. A list of databases that include this phrase in the descriptive text will be retrieved. Search the same fields using the words "digital", "digitized", or "page image." Your search terms must appear in the selected fields for this method to be successful.

To access subscription databases from off-campus, you MUST enter through the law library Research Databases page. You will then be prompted for your law school network ID and password.

Keep in mind that electronic resources are continuously evolving in content, coverage and quality. New databases will appear and established databases will change in appearance as more titles are added to the content, inclusive dates are expanded and searching, display and downloading features are improved. Some databases may be discontinued or merge with others and occasionally individual titles are dropped from a database. Once you familiarize yourself with the uniform characteristics and desirable features of some primary research databases, you will easily adapt to routine changes and recognize what to look for when searching an unfamiliar database for the first time.

C. What Advantages Can Other Research Databases Have Over Westlaw and Lexis?

Access to the full version of Westlaw or Lexis requires the assignment of an individual password available only to UConn Law faculty, staff, and students. Most of our other research databases are available without restriction to all patrons in the library. The research databases are also available to UConn Law faculty, staff, and students off-campus through remote access to the law school's network. Many research databases can be used effectively without special instruction. Much of the content included on Westlaw and Lexis can be found elsewhere online in a more desirable format. Periodical databases developed by scholarly organizations, universities and journal publishers often provide electronic text in digital page image format identical to the print edition. Westlaw and Lexis content often appears in less preferred html full text that may be unacceptable for certain research purposes such as law review cite checks. Coverage of non-legal subject areas also tends to be more selective on Westlaw and Lexis. Westlaw and Lexis typically offer less retrospective coverage of full text articles than scholarly or historical research databases that have focused on developing deep digital archives.

D. Which E-Journal Databases Offer the Most Content in PDF Full Text?

Although many databases include some content in full text, only a portion of this content may appear in digital page image (PDF) Portable Document Format. Look for distinctive icons or labels displayed in listed search results indicating whether an article is available as an abstract, in html full text or in PDF page image duplicating the original printed page. **Hein Online** and **JSTOR** offer advanced searching features similar to periodical indexes but retrieve all results in PDF full text from the very first volume of each journal included. JSTOR offers scholarly journals in a variety of subjects and includes some major law reviews and legal periodicals. Coverage dates move forward as more recent volumes are added to the Hein and JSTOR archives. The Hein Online Law Journal Library is just one segment of a vast digital archive of primary legal materials and texts that is continuously expanding in scope. E. How Can I Find Articles in Legal Periodicals?

Select the link (<http://www.law.uconn.edu/school-law-library/legal-periodical-indexes>) to **Legal Periodical Indexes** on the law library's Web page if your research is limited to law-specific issues. The two major legal periodical indexes are **Index to Legal Periodicals** and **LegalTrac**. These cover more recent articles and include citations to additional sources that do not appear in Hein Online. **Index to Legal Periodicals** provides cumulative coverage of citations in law reviews, bar journals, yearbooks and other scholarly legal publications from 1908 to the present with selective links to full text from databases such as Hein Online and JSTOR. LegalTrac covers 1980 to the present with abstracts, selective full text from 1994, and includes legal newspapers and specialty publications not treated in Index to Legal Periodicals. Neither index is searchable by brief citation, but you can decipher abbreviations by browsing the title list of included publications. **Current Index to Legal Periodicals** provides a current awareness source of legal citations arranged by subject and table of contents listings from the most recently published law reviews and journals.

F. Where Can I Find Historical Newspapers, Documents and Legal Treatises in Digital Image?

A growing number of databases provide archival coverage of newspapers, classic legal treatises, photographs, and other historical materials in full text digital image format. These digital collections include cover to cover facsimile reproduction of rare books, articles and government documents. Early

American Imprints and LLMC represent existing microfiche collections converted to fully searchable, printable digital page image format. Coverage dates expand as additional content is digitized.

G. How Can I Find Current Law-Related Articles in Non-Legal Periodicals?

A number of multi-disciplinary databases covering a broad range of subject areas are available at the law library. These provide an excellent starting point for law-related research involving topics beyond the scope of the traditional legal periodical indexes. Publishers generally limit full text access to specific journal titles subscribed to by the university. The following databases offer law-related multi-disciplinary citations and abstracts. All but Ingenta link to selective PDF full text for more recent dates:

I. How Can I Determine Whether We Have Access to a Particular Journal Electronically?

Search for the journal in the **law library catalog** (<http://uconn.law.uconn.edu/>). Please note that you must search by the full title of the journal (exact phrase or words connected by AND in a WORD search) and not by abbreviation or citation. You may find a record in the catalog with a link to the electronic copy in a collection such as Hein Online or JSTOR. This can also be useful if you are looking for a paper volume that is missing from the shelf or at the bindery.

The best method for accessing a journal that does not appear in the law library catalog but may still be available university-wide through a subscription research database is via the **E-Journal Locator** (<http://tk8nj5xn8a.search.serialssolutions.com/>) on the law library's Web page. Enter a journal title in the search box and the results will display links to databases that cover the journal for specific date ranges. Dates of coverage periodically move forward or expand as content is added. Most electronic subscriptions are accessible at the law library and many provide full text in PDF. To access university-wide databases from off-campus, use the link on the E-Journal Locator page to **Log in to the VPN** (https://vpn.uconn.edu/dana-na/auth/url_default/welcome.cgi) and enter your NetID and password.

You can also access electronic versions by searching for a journal title in the **Homer catalog** (www.lib.uconn.edu) on the main campus University Libraries page. A journal that does not appear in the law library catalog may appear in Homer with a link to an electronic edition that is accessible university-wide. Links from the catalog record to publisher collections such as Oxford Journals Online (www.oxfordjournals.org) or Cambridge Journals Online (<http://journals.cambridge.org>) provide PDF full text back to the 1990's.

Another convenient method for accessing full text journals online is by searching **WorldCat** through the law library's account (<http://www.law.uconn.edu/library/database/worldcat>). WorldCat includes records for electronic editions that link directly to full text coverage at the university. If a WorldCat record provides links to multiple databases you may need to try more than one to determine which represents an active subscription at the university.

Look for links to full text from citations listed in your results when searching any index/database on the law library's Web page. Citations from the National Library of Medicine's **PubMed** database (<http://www.law.uconn.edu/library/database/pubmed>), for example, will link to full text articles in medical journals currently subscribed to by the UConn Health Center Library. Simply select a citation from your list of search results to display the full text options.

J. How Do Free Resources on the Web Compare With Subscription Research Databases?

In addition to subscription databases, the law library's Web page provides direct **Web Research Links** (<http://www.law.uconn.edu/school-law-library/web-research-links>) to numerous free sources of authoritative online information organized in a variety of categories. A public version of the **Martindale-Hubbell Lawyer Directory** (<http://www.martindale.com/>) provides limited but useful information. **LibWeb** (<http://lists.webjunction.org/libweb/>) provides access to library catalogs throughout the world in a directory of links arranged by library type and region. The law library's Web Research Links also includes links to federal, state, municipal, academic, and official organization websites where current PDF documents and legal forms can be found.

Connecticut Official Websites

The **Connecticut Judicial Branch** (www.jud.state.ct.us) website provides a variety of official full text resources for attorneys and self-help materials for the public including PDF legal forms, the **Connecticut Practice Book**, (<http://www.jud.ct.gov/pb.htm>) Code of Evidence, civil and criminal jury instructions, court rules and civil procedures (<http://www.jud.ct.gov/selfhelp.htm>).

Federal Government Websites

Federal Web links (<http://www.law.uconn.edu/node/3495>) including **Thomas** at the Library of Congress (<http://thomas.loc.gov/>) and **GPO Access** at the Government Printing Office (www.gpoaccess.gov/legislative.html) provide full text government publications and Federal legislative materials. Although Lexis/Nexis Congressional and other subscription databases may offer more user-friendly search options for retrieving legislative history materials, Thomas and GPO Access provide free access to a growing archive of official government publications in PDF including digital versions of the Congressional Record, the Federal Register and the CFR. Additionally, at the Library of Congress, **A Century of Lawmaking** (<http://memory.loc.gov/ammem/amlaw/lawhome.html>) covers Congressional Documents and Debates from 1774 - 1875 in digital page image full text, and **Chronicling America** (<http://www.loc.gov/chroniclingamerica/>) provides access to a growing database of historical American newspapers.

International Links

Foreign, Comparative and International Law Web Links (<http://www.law.uconn.edu/node/3497>) covers sources that list and describe major foreign sites as **Europa** (http://europa.eu/index_en.htm) where official European Union documents can be found in full text. The Global Legal International Network (**GLIN**) and the World Legal Information Institute (**WorldLII**) provide access to international legal materials by country or region.

Insurance Links

The Law library's **Insurance Law Collection** Web page provides special treatment of insurance resources (<http://www.law.uconn.edu/school-law-library/insurance-law-collection-research>). Unique and historical materials in the insurance collection are highlighted and links are provided to relevant databases and websites covering state, federal and foreign insurance laws and regulations.

Google

Google (www.google.com) and other popular search engines included under **Library Web Links** provide advanced search options to locate PDF full text documents directly on the Web. Searching Google with an exact phrase, date and author can be a remarkably efficient means of retrieving specific reports, research papers, and special studies published by official entities in recent years. **Google Books**, **Google Scholar** and **Google Patent Search** provide enhanced access to specialized databases of full text books and other documents that may be freely accessible on the Web. Additionally, **Google Scholar** can provide an alternate means of access to UConn full text ejournals at the article level. Searching for specific articles on Google Scholar may retrieve UConn full text links to the current content of journals not covered for recent dates in Ejournal Locator.

K. How Can I Find Additional Sources of Subject-Specific Information?

The broad range of subject oriented databases available university-wide can be extremely relevant and useful in supplementing law-related research. Consult the Research Databases page for more comprehensive treatment of database topics. Use the **Search Database List** option to search for databases on specific subjects using keywords. Check all of the field boxes to retrieve a list of databases where the keywords appear in the *database title*, *description* or *annotation*.
