GUIDELINES FOR INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE VISITOR (J-1 VISA)

Financial Support: The minimum amount of monthly financial support (net income) for a single person is estimated at \$1,800. This figure represents the minimum required by the U.S. Department of State.

Housing: Exchange students needing assistance in locating housing should contact Blanche Capilos, blanche.capilos@law.uconn.edu

Medical Insurance: HEALTH INSURANCE IS MANDATORY! International exchange students are required to have medical insurance. The Department of International Exchange Programs can recommend medical plans designed for foreign nationals.

Travel Plans: An Exchange Visitor's authorized stay in the U.S. is limited to the dates entered on the Certificate of Eligibility (Form DS-2019). Entry to the U.S. is permitted a few weeks before and after the beginning date entered on the form.

Off-Campus Employment: Exchange Visitors (J-1 visa holders) are limited by governing regulations to the academic employment in their sponsoring department at UConn.

Federal and State Income Taxes: Any payment while in the U.S., by either payroll or voucher, will likely incur taxes. Certain people may benefit from a tax treaty. In general, foreign nationals earning any money in the U.S. must file a tax return, even if their earning are below the minimum established annually by the IRS or if they are beneficiaries of a tax treaty. Visitors are encouraged to determine their tax status by contacting the Payroll Office prior to working.

Department of International Services and Programs (DISP): DISP is located at the main campus of the University in Storrs, Connecticut. Visa officers are available to assist students with questions and problems.
