

The University of Connecticut School of Law provides students with the opportunity to specialize their law studies and has established certificate programs to formalize this study. For most of these programs, students must only meet the criteria as outlined in the Student Handbook. Juris Doctor students hoping to specialize in **Human Rights** are required to make formal application to the program. Students hoping to specialize in **Public Policy** are required to seek approval of their program from the Faculty Advisor. For all others, award of the certificate is determined by review of the student's transcript by the registrar's office. Students intending to receive a certificate are asked to complete this application as it facilitates the transfer of credit (where applicable) and review of credentials. It is asked that students complete this form in the semester that they begin taking certificate appropriate courses. Completion of the form does not constitute approval of certificate studies or completion of requirements.
